We appreciate that many have never attended a full day at a school setting before and that can be exhausting! 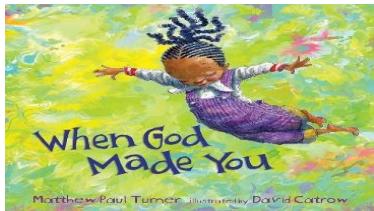
The children are doing very well at coming into Reception independently. We have been showing the children how to hang their coat up by the hook, how to turn the arms of their coat the right way around and how to take off jumpers/cardigans if too hot and place in their tray. Well done Children!

Our theme for this half term is 'Creation-Good to be Me'. We will be focusing on the Personal, Social and Emotional Development of your child. We have been getting to know each other a little bit more by doing lots of circle time activities and talking about ourselves. **We would like the children to talk about their family members. Please could we ask you to send a family photo on Tapestry. We will print the photos off and display them in our 'home' area.**

We have talked about following the Reception rules and being the best friend we can be at all times. We know sometimes this can be a difficult task and therefore have talked about what to do when situations arise which we don't like or don't agree with. We aim to work on the children's listening skills and their ability to sit still at carpet times for periods of time. To help us with our listening, we have introduced 'Mimi' the listening mouse. 'Mimi's Listening Rules are:

- A good listener tries to stay quiet
- A good listener looks at the speaker
- A good listener tries to remember what the speaker has said

Please could you reinforce these with your child at home. Thank you



Branch 1 Creation-Good to be Me

In this first branch of our religious teaching, we hear how God made our beautiful world and everything in it, including us. We learn that the Bible is a special book and hear that when God created the world He said: "Indeed it is very good", Genesis 1:31. God tells us that we must take good care of all of creation. We are to be stewards of creation - it is an extremely important job. We hear and practise the

words and actions of the sign of the cross throughout the day: In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The children come to believe that God is love; that He made each one of us and loves each one of us as a unique person. God loves us and we are part of His family. We celebrate God's family and recall how we entered it through Baptism.

We give thanks to God by reflecting on creation and responding to its glory through art, drama, dance, music, meditation and prayer. We learn to live out our faith by loving ourselves, our family, God's world and others. We learn through Catholic Social Teaching about the Stewardship- Looking after God's World and Dignity of the Human Person; that God made each one of us and each one of us is special; we must treat others in a caring way because God made them too.

At home you could help your children by:

- Saying prayers together and making the sign of the cross.
- Looking at pictures of animals and plants and talking about how special creation is.
- Encourage them to notice different parts of God's wonderful creations and think of ways to care for the world
