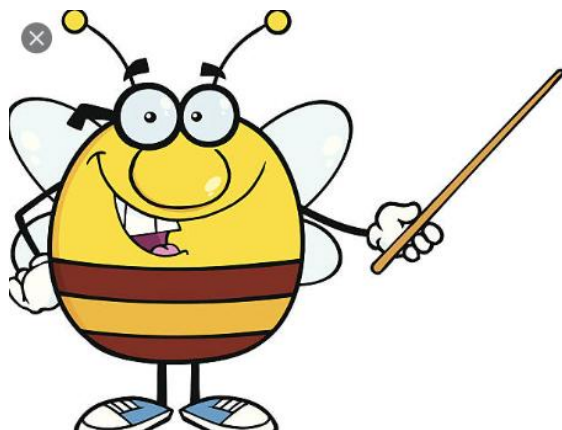

Dear Year 6,

Top tips for learning spellings. Read and write them as often as possible. Can you think of a mnemonic/draw a word? Different ways of learning spellings work better for different brains. Try a different one each week initially. Some people find adding colour to highlight a rule or pattern helps. Someone else liked writing them all on a bookmark so that they'd glance at them every day. Another child I taught swore that if he closed his eyes and wrote them out with his left foot they stuck better.

A few children genuinely find it difficult to spell due to a specific learning difficulty. You will all know which spellings I expect you to learn and practise.
