# Reception Newsletter - Autumn 1

## We are delighted to Welcome you all to Reception

It's been a busy start to the new academic year. We are amazed at how well the children are coping with settling into their new environment. Over the past few days (as well as being elbow deep in water and paint) we have been learning about the basic rules and procedures in our Reception class to ensure everyone can play happily together in a safe and well-organised environment. We appreciate that many have never attended a full day at a school setting before and that can be exhausting! We've all had great fun getting to know our new friends and we are so happy you have joined our wonderful class!! The children are doing very well at coming into Reception independently. We have been showing the children how to hang their coat up by the hook, how to turn the arms of their coat the right way around and how to take off jumpers/cardigans if too hot and place in their tray. Well done Children!

Our theme for this half term is 'Creation-Good to be Me'. We will be focusing on the Personal, Social and Emotional Development of your child. We have been getting to know each other a little bit more by doing lots of circle time activities and talking about ourselves. **We would like the children to talk about their family members. Please could we ask you to send a family photo on Tapestry. We will print the photos off and display them in our 'home' area.** 

We have talked about following the Reception rules and being the best friend we can be at all times. We know sometimes this can be a difficult task and therefore have talked about what to do when situations arise which we don't like or don't agree with. We aim to work on the children's listening skills and their ability to sit still at carpet times for periods of time. To help us with our listening, we have introduced 'Mimi' the listening mouse and 'Mimi's Listening Rules' which are:

- A good listener tries to sit still
- A good listener tries to stay quiet
- A good listener looks at the speaker

• A good listener tries to remember what the speaker has said Please could you reinforce these with your child at home. Thank you





#### Reception – Creation and Good to Be Me

"Creation is the first and universal revelation of God's love" This half term, the children will be learning about God's world. Throughout this topic, the children will begin to appreciate the beauty of the world and know that God made it. They will

learn that God loves and cares for each one of us and reflect on this. They will hear about and respond to the things God created for us. They will know that God has asked us to care for the world and think of ways in which we can help to do it. They will learn that we can spoil God's world and that we have a responsibility to look after it. Also, the children will be exploring 'All about Me and My Family'. Please talk to your child about these topics and the language that will be used (e.g. brother, sister, Grandad, house number etc.) To tie in with this topic if any grandparents would like to come and read a story at the end of our school day, please let a member of staff know.

## At home you could help your children by:

- Saying prayers together and making the sign of the cross.
- Looking at pictures of animals and plants and talking about how special creation is.
- Encourage them to notice different parts of God's wonderful creations and think of ways to care for the world
