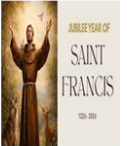

Our Ofsted Inspection – A Celebration of All Saints'

I am delighted to finally share with you the outcome of our recent Ofsted inspection, which took place on 3rd and 4th February. We are incredibly proud of the report, which reflects the hard work, dedication and care that define our whole school community, and the love we have for our fabulous school.

You will clearly notice the Inspectors recognised that All Saints' is a school where pupils truly thrive. They highlighted our highly inclusive culture, where every child is known, valued and supported to succeed. It was particularly pleasing that they noted how staff know pupils extremely well and build caring and compassionate relationships that help children feel safe, confident and ready to learn – this is so important to us.

The report celebrates the strong attitudes to learning seen across the school. Inspectors commented on pupils' consistently positive attitudes, describing classrooms as focused environments where pupils work diligently. They also recognised the calm and respectful atmosphere throughout the school, noting that behaviour is excellent and that pupils show genuine care for one another.

We are especially proud that inspectors highlighted the quality of teaching and learning. They recognised that our knowledgeable staff skillfully design learning activities and that children get off to a flying start in their education. The teaching of early reading was praised, with children quickly learning to read and developing strong foundations for future success. Across the school, pupils were recognised as producing high-quality work and achieving well, particularly in reading, writing and mathematics.

Inclusion is at the heart of everything we do, and it was wonderful to see this acknowledged so strongly. Inspectors noted that barriers to learning are skillfully broken down and that pupils with additional needs and those who are disadvantaged make superb progress from their starting points. This reflects our unwavering commitment to ensuring that every child flourishes.

The report also highlights the exceptional personal development of our pupils. They are described as curious, resilient and increasingly independent individuals, with a strong moral compass and a clear understanding of right and wrong. Inspectors were impressed by the many opportunities that pupils have to contribute to the wider community and develop their talents through a rich range of experiences.

Our Early Years department was recognized as a truly special place where every child's journey begins with joy, care and a deep sense of belonging, where caring and compassionate relationships help children feel safe, valued and ready to flourish.

Inspectors commented on the expert teaching, high expectations and inspiring learning experiences which help our children quickly grow in confidence, curiosity and independence.

Above all, I was particularly pleased to read that All Saints' comes to life each morning when pupils arrive to eagerly begin the school day. This truly captures the spirit of our school.

As always, safeguarding remains a top priority. Inspectors confirmed that we have an open and positive culture of safeguarding, where pupils are made safer and feel safe.

This report is a testament to our wonderful children, our dedicated staff, our supportive governors, and you – our fabulous families. Thank you for your continued encouragement, support and partnership. Together, we have created something very special.

While we are proud of this outcome, we remain committed to continuous improvement and will continue working to ensure the very best for every child at All Saints'.
